

MAS REMAINS RESILIENT THROUGH THE PANDEMIC

Unlike previous annual summaries that have trumpeted reliable budgetary and operational growth over thirteen consecutive years, this one will not.

Instead, this year the organization would like to celebrate the extraordinary social capital that kept MAS afloat through the pandemic in Manchester & Nashua.

Despite being closed for almost 1/3 of the year, and re-opening under necessary restrictions that reduced available capacity by 50%, both clinics remained viable, returning to operation when allowed to do so by the State of NH. The reason for this is largely due to three factors:

- 1) People returning to clinic to receive treatments.
- 2) Generous individual donations offered to support operations, and
- 3) Financial aid in the form of federal and state grants and loans.

Let me make no bones about this; if not for our patients and supporters, MAS would have had to cease operations in some manner.


